



Editorial Policy

Mandate of the Journal

Given the importance of linguistic duality in the definition of Canadian identity and the challenges that linguistic minorities face in Canada and elsewhere, the Canadian Institute for Research on Linguistic Minorities and its partners created the scientific journal *Minorités linguistiques et société/Linguistic Minorities and Society*. The mandate of the journal is to disseminate research results and analyses regarding Official Language Minority Communities in Canada, as well as other linguistic minorities in Canada and elsewhere, from an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary perspective in the language sciences, the social sciences, and the humanities. With a focus on comparative and international studies, the journal seeks to shed more light on linguistic minorities.

Issues of the Journal

This is a biannual journal. There are regular issues published under the responsibility of the editor of the journal, special or thematic issues entrusted to guest editors, and mixed issues that combine a specific theme and open topics.

Types of Articles

The journal publishes various kinds of original work that explores topics related to linguistic minorities:

1. qualitative and quantitative scientific research papers presenting:
 - a) unpublished research results;
 - b) the state of a research question based on published empirical data (e.g., a systematic review of published empirical research on a given subject);
2. theoretical research papers;
3. research notes, syntheses on a specific subject, or critical essays on topics related to linguistic minorities;
4. reviews of published works on linguistic minorities or of interest to them.

Target Audience

Although the journal publishes articles that meet scientific requirements and are intended for specialists, it requests that authors ensure that their articles are accessible to a broad, well-informed public including decision-makers and stakeholders in the field of linguistic minorities.

Language of Publication

The journal is bilingual (English and French). Authors can publish in either English or French (with no systematic translation of articles or book reviews). Abstracts of the articles will, however, be published in both languages.

Dissemination

The journal is available online at www.erudit.org and is thus available anywhere there is Internet.

Exclusive Manuscript Submission Agreement

All manuscripts are submitted exclusively to the journal. In other words, manuscripts sent to the journal must not have been previously published or been sent for publication elsewhere. Any exemption from this rule must be discussed with the editor of the journal.

Author Views

The views expressed in the articles published by the journal are solely those of the authors.

Reproduction of Published Articles

No article accepted for publication by the journal may be published subsequently elsewhere without the written consent of the editor.

Correspondence

All correspondence for regular or open issues of the journal should be directed to the editor. In the case of special issues of the journal, authors should communicate with the guest editor(s) for whom contact information will be provided.
